**Directions on How to Fill out Study Abroad Planning Chart

This form serves as a starting point in your research to find the most appropriate study abroad program for you. Please follow the instructions and *see your departmental advisor/s first* for approval then see a dean in 104 O'Shaughnessy Hall. When you are ready to seek approval from a dean, call (574) 631-7098 for an appointment or come in during walk-ins times. *Remember to complete one form per site.*

- 1) Look at the big picture and think about the following questions when selecting a program:

What language/s do you speak? Would you like to take courses abroad in that language? Do you have the preparation for these programs?

How long do you want to be abroad? What semester would you like to go abroad? Check the duration of the program/s. Although many programs follow the US calendar, several do not. Check if the program is a year-long only program such as Trinity, Dublin or Oxford.

Think about what courses you plan to take abroad and what you will take when you return. Look 3-4 semesters down the road. This may affect what you take next semester in preparation for your return semester/s.
