Responsibilities include supervising multiple sections of first and second-year language and culture classes, assisting in the training, supervision, and mentoring of graduate student teaching assistants and first-year lecturers, and periodically teaching a graduate course in foreign language pedagogy and methodology.

Preference will be given to candidates with demonstrated excellence in teaching, prior coordinating or administrative experience, familiarity with a range of language-teaching methodologies, including technology-related pedagogy and pedagogy through theatre, and experience in curriculum development and assessment. Native or near-native proficiency in Italian, minimum of five years of experience teaching at the university level and PhD or equivalent are required; knowledge of Latin and/or another Romance language highly desirable.
